we currently have more than 55 active brothers, including our most recent pledge class of 6 fine young men. The current pledges hail from around the globe and add much character and diversity to an already strong chapter here at Valpo. With the increasing standards needed for admittance to Valparaiso University, Indiana Epsilon has seen strong growth academically each year. Along with an aggressive recruitment program the house has also focused more on internal Brotherhood events. Retreats and goals setting sessions along with more frequent 'Brother's Nights' have brought the house closer together.

We have also strived to improve and remain dedicated to philanthropic activities. In the past year the chapter has chosen to concentrate much of its efforts on the local community. Not only did we perform our usual highway cleanup more frequently than in the past, but our level of commitment was higher than in previous years. This past year we completed more community service hours than any other Greek organization totaling more than 2300 hours. We have also begun a new community focused mentoring program. Working in coordination with Valparaiso University, brothers drafted a proposal for a Lilly Foundation Grant in order to fund this mentoring program. Chapter was awarded \$4,000 in order to mentor eight local middle school aged boys. Brothers meet weekly with the group and provide structured activities ranging from sports and video games to

#### House Corporation Update

This past year has been busy for the Housing Corporation.

In late March the chapter house experienced a minor fire in one of the suites on the third floor. While there was no structural damage, water and smoke damage occurred in the affected room as well as the hallway just outside the room. Needless to say, repairs and renovations of the affected space dominated much of the rest of the

budgets, but even with more than 50 active brothers, there simply wasn't enough funding to address every need.

By July, it became clear that the House Corp. would need to seek some outside financing. Lingering expenses from the March fire as well as a dire need to replace the fire alarm system made quick action necessary. A decision was made to apply to The Endowment Fund of Phi Kappa Psi for a second mortgage in the amount of \$30,000.

This mortgage takes advantage of the sizeable balance of the Chapter Scholarship Fund and allows us to borrow (at a competitive rate) for brick and mortar needs. This loan does not affect the amount of money available for scholarship awards, and interest paid on the loan benefits the Endowment Fund as income.

This loan allowed us to retire debts to the con-

tractor that renovated the rooms involved in the fire, and made possible the complete replacement of the fire alarm system. The old system (while still operational due to the skill of some undergraduate brothers) was a patchwork of equipment from several vendors and had aged to the point that parts were difficult to obtain and knowledgeable service was almost impossible to find.

Additionally, we were able to upgrade the electrical service to the house. The demand on the electrical system has increased exponentially over the years with the addition of computers, stereos, televisions and air conditioners. None of these items were anticipated when the house was built in 1970. In the fall of 2001, the electrical demand actually caused a failure in the meter serving the building that lead to an outage requiring emergency service. This upgrade should handle the electrical demand for some years to come.

Finally, some bothersome plumbing problems were addressed. For many years the chapter house had been plagued with repeated plumbing back-ups that caused damage to hallway carpet as well as sanitation concerns and high plumbing repair bills. A contractor was employed to rout

the drain lines in the house and power-flush the years of buildup that had accumulated from hard use. Additionally, new fixtures were purchased and installed for the second and third floor bathrooms. The chapter has reported that the plumbing has been problem free for the first time in years.

It is necessary to note that many undergraduate brothers participated in the research and gathering of bids that made these projects possible. Without their dedication and determination, many of these repairs would not have been possible.

But we can't stop with what has been done. There are still several maintenance projects that must be addressed. For one, the condition of the gutter system must be improved. There is noticeable soffit decay that needs to be repaired as well

Another is the replacement of the existing windows. The chapter study room and the room that was affected by the fire have both received new double hung insulated windows. Those windows replace single pane, Plexiglas windows that have never served their purpose well. If the rest of these substandard windows were replaced with similar windows, there would be a noticable reduction of utility costs and much inprovement in comfort to the residents.

As we look ahead to the coming years, we realize that though we are fortunate to have a house in such great shape, there are still and will continue to be maintenance concerns that will need to be addressed. Hopefully, we can address those concerns quickly and efficiently.
